Upon completion of active military service he worked as a assistant to then Professor Jack B. Weinstein at Columbia Law School and clerked for Herbert B. Cohen, Associate Justice of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court. Subsequent to that practiced estates, trusts, real estate, commercial and transportation law with several firms including Schwab Goldberg Price & Dannay which eventually merged into Cowan, Liebowitz & Latman.

At McLaughlin & Stern, which Mr. Price joined in 2010, he specializes in estate planning, preparation of wills and trusts, estate administration and real estate.
